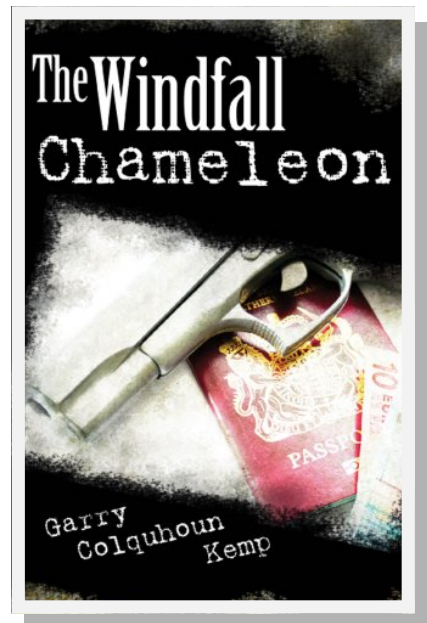
## Meet the Author—Garry Kemp

N/L invites you to spend a fascinating evening with local author Garry Kemp at 5 pm on April 10 at the Old Kinderhook Trophy Room to discuss his first novel, "The Windfall Chameleon." The story, much of which is set here at the lake, follows the adventures of a Tulsa homicide detective who is drawn into a wild ride of deceit and international intrigue among warring extremist groups following the murder of an Oklahoma oil tycoon. The escalating tensions lead to a gripping and unexpected finale in the heart of London.

Before fulfilling his lifelong desire to write a novel, Garry led a fascinating and varied life. After working briefly for the BBC, he became one of many quite famous (and infamous) DJs who took a stand against the BBC's restrictive programming to establish Radio Caroline in 1964.

"Pirate Radio" helped to deliver the soundtrack of the '60s to millions of fans from ships anchored outside the territorial waters of the UK. His wide following led him to jobs in radio with BBC, Radio Luxembourg and Britain Radio for awhile before becoming a travel guide in Europe. On one of his tours, he met an American lady named Sally, whom he later married.

The couple returned to the US four years later. While in Tulsa, OK, Garry gained the distinction of being America's only English country and western DJ. He also hosted several classical music shows and wrote the society column for the evening paper. After moving to New York, he took his talents to the stage, appearing in plays there as well as in London and Tulsa. He also wrote and performed in commercials, winning



awards for both, and was additionally recognized for a number of short stories and children's tales. In between he held various jobs teaching English, working at a rubbish dump, selling door-to-door and working as

a waiter/barman. Most recently, he hosted a talk radio program here at the lake. His book borrows from his wide array of life experiences.

"I'm not really much into politics or International events, but occasion-

ally some injustices seem too important to be ignored," said Mr. Kemp. "That's how the germ of Windfall Chameleon came to be. I simply am bewildered that two peoples who have shared the same land for centuries are still unable – or unwilling – to live in harmony. And it's not always the obvious vil-

lains who prove to be the villains at all."
